



## **PE & SPORT PREMIUM REPORT 2013-14**

### **BACKGROUND**

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. The Government is spending over £450 million on this funding over the 3 academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016.

Schools receive PE and sport premium funding based on the number of pupils in years 1 to 6. Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £8,000 and an additional payment of £5 per pupil.

Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best of way using of the money.

For example, schools can use funding to:

- hire specialist PE teachers
- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with teaching resources to help them teach PE and sport
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and [Change4Life](#) clubs
- run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the [School Games](#)
- run sports activities with other schools.

### **RIDGEWAY MIDDLE SCHOOL**

Ridgeway received £8,407.50 during the academic year 2013-14 for its PE & Sports Grant. The funding has been spent in a variety of ways:

- Ridgeway has employed a PE Apprentice. This new member is not only supporting the teaching and learning of sport in school, but also helping to run after school clubs and allowing the school to invest in the future of a young person from our community and supporting them in the achievement of a Level 3 qualification.
- Ridgeway has purchased new equipment to rejuvenate current sports in school – cricket, football, netball.
- Ridgeway has purchased equipment to provide new sports at the school – table tennis, badminton.
- Training of current staff – 2 teachers have attended training sessions run by Netball UK to upskill them in teaching the sport.
- Competition entry – various teams and individuals have been entered into competitions for golf, football, cricket.
- Supporting the School Sport Partnership in Redditch through the release of a staff member for one afternoon per week.



## **ACADEMIC YEAR 2014-15**

Ridgeway should receive around £8,500 for PE & Sports in the next academic year. The plans for these funds include:

- Continued funding of the PE Apprentice and extending this individual to support a local First School for one morning a week to drive PE throughout our community.
- Purchase of more table tennis equipment to enable to it progress from an after school sports club/lunchtime activity into one that can be run as part of the curriculum.
- Continued support to the School Sport Partnership in Redditch through the release on a staff member for one afternoon per week.
